## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO VAASA AND THE BOTHNIAN COASTLINE, FINLAND

LOCATION: Vaasa (Vasa to those inhabitants who prefer Swedish) is located in southwestern Finland. The city is situated on a small, protected bay off the Gulf of Bothnia, with ferry connections to Sweden across the Gulf. Elevations are generally close to sea level. Both the city and the surrounding farmland have sizeable Swedish populations.

COMMENTS: Vaasa has a Scandinavian version of the traditional mid-latitude four-season year. The combination of the prevailing winds from the west and its location on the eastern side of the Gulf, serves to delay the seasons somewhat over places farther inland. Spring runs from late April through early June, summer extends from late June through the end of August, and autumn lasts from early September through the middle of October. Winter (mid-October through mid-April) is the dominant season at these latitudes, and dictates many aspects of both the landscape and the lifestyles. Although well south of the Arctic Circle, the combination of long days and twilight gives the area virtually continuous daylight for about 55 days centered on Midsummer. Since at least part of the sun's disc appears above the horizon (even though usually obscured by clouds) every day of the year, there is no equivalent midwinter period of dark.
