SUNSHINE GUIDE TO GENEVA AND LAKE LEMAN, SWITZERLAND

LOCATION: Geneva is located at the far western end of both Switzerland and Lake Leman (Lake Geneva). The city is situated where the lake drains into the Rhone River. Elevations are in the neighborhood of 1,300 feet above sea level. The city and its suburbs are virtually surrounded by France on three sides, but the atmosphere is distinctly international.

COMMENTS: The region has the standard European four-season year. Summers are short, sunny, and warm. Hot days are rare. Winters are long and cold. Only one day in six or seven will fail to rise above freezing during the afternoon. Snow is a frequent visitor, but more winter rain falls than snow, and the frequent thaws keep the ground snow-free much of the time--especially in the city proper. Spring and autumn are transitional seasons in terms of weather, but are distinguished by obvious changes in the vegetation. The "bise", a northeasterly gale, often brings bright clear weather to an otherwise cloudy winter season. It also brings severely cold temperatures. These strong, cold winds off the lake may coat nearby vegetation and structures with layers of ice. Many lakeshore homes have no doors or windows on their northeast sides.
