SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE TUSCALOOSA AREA, ALABAMA

LOCATION: Tuscaloosa (the name means "black river" in Choctaw), is located in west-central Alabama, some fifty miles southwest of Birmingham. The city is situated on the Black Warrior River in the lower foothills of the southwestern tip of the Appalachian Mountains. It is best known as the site of the University of Alabama. It is also the site of a Mercedes-Benz factory and considerable paper production. Elevations are around 150 feet above sea level.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 60% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 46% in December and January, to a high of 67% in May, June, and October. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to 12 on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 102 on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be up to 5° warmer than actual ones during the heat of the summer, and two to three degrees cooler than actual ones the rest of the year. The best weather occurs in April and October, especially the latter month. Summers are long, hot, and humid. Winters are short, mild, and humid. Snow flurries occur most years, but snow on the ground is rare.
