## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO VOYAGEURS NATIONAL PARK, MINNESOTA

LOCATION: Voyageurs National Park is located in northeastern Minnesota, up against the Ontario border. The Park covers some 220,000 acres of lakes, rivers, and forests—but only contains about three miles of roads. Access is by boat, on foot, or by floatplane. Visitors Centers are located at Rainy Lake, Kabetogama Lake, and Ash River. There is also a ranger station at Crane Lake. International Falls is the major staging point for visits to the Park. Elevations within the Park are around 1,000 feet above sea level.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 43% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 25% in November, to a high of 54% in August. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -37°, and the highest should be near 93°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as or a touch cooler than actual ones. Winter is the dominant season, with the lakes and streams freezing over sometime in November and remaining frozen until sometime in April. Below-zero temperatures are nightly occurrences from early December through early March, and temperatures may remain below zero for a week or more in midwinter. Spring is a very brief season, usually lasting little more than a month (May, more or less). Summers feature warm days and cool to chilly nights. Autumn is often prolonged well into late November, and is a generally pleasant season with some cold (or very cold) spells.
