SUNSHINE GUIDE TO GLASGOW AND THE SCOTTISH LOWLANDS, SCOTLAND

LOCATION: Glasgow, Scotland's second city after Edinburgh, is located at the head of navigation on the River Clyde, in west-central Scotland. Elevations within the Glasgow area are within a few hundred feet of sea level. Its latitude of almost 56° north is equal to that of southern Alaska.

COMMENTS: The region has a four-season year, much moderated by the winds from the west off of the North Atlantic Ocean. These winds keep the summers from getting as hot and the winters from getting as cold as they otherwise would. Summer afternoons are long, cloudy, humid, and mild. Warm days will occur from time to time, but hot ones skip most years. Summer nights are short, cool, and damp. Heavy morning dews are common. Winter afternoons are short, overcast, very humid, quite windy, and chilly more often than cold. Only about one winter night in three will drop below freezing by morning, and the afternoons are almost always above freezing--although not by much. Snowfalls and flurries can be expected from November through April, but winter rains are more common than snow, and the latter rarely stays on the ground for long--especially in the city. Canny Glaswegians wear wool, knowing that it dries from the inside out, and keeps a body dry and warm when the weather is wet and cold.
