SUNSHINE GUIDE TO TRABZON AND THE BLACK SEA COAST, TURKEY

LOCATION: Trabzon (the ancient Trapezus) is located at the eastern end of Turkey's Black Sea coast. This part of the coast is well-watered and not quite subtropical. Elevations within the city range from sea level to several hundred feet above it on the plateau ("trapezus") that supports the old city. This part of the coast grows tobacco, watermelons, tea, cherries, hazelnuts, and other similar crops. Back of the narrow coastal strip, however, the climate becomes much more severe.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 41% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 32% in March and April, to a high of 52% in August. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to 27 on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 91 on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be two to three degrees cooler than actual ones, due to the winds off the Black Sea. Summer afternoons are generally warm, sometimes hot. Winter afternoons are generally cool, sometimes cold. Snow flurries occur throughout the cold season, but snow on the ground past noon of the next day is rare. The mountains behind the city, however, may be snow-covered most of the winter.
