## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE PUERTO MALDONADO AREA, PERU

LOCATION: Puerto Maldonado is located in southeastern Peru, in the department of Madre de Dios. The town is situated in the eastern foothills of the Andes Mountains, at the junction of the Madre de Dios and Tambopata Rivers. These waters eventually flow into the Amazon River. Elevations in town are between 800 and 900 feet above sea level. Once covered by dense rain forest, the area around town has been almost completely logged off.

COMMENTS: The area has a tropical two-season year based on rainfall. Temperatures do not vary much from one month to another. Nor is there much difference in the length of the daylight period from one month to another. As far as weather goes, any particular day could just as easily occur in any month of the year. The major differences in the seasons is rainfall. The rainy season runs from October through April, the dry season from May through September. The *friajes* are cold spells brought in by frigid winds from the south. They can drop the temperatures by up to 40° in a very short time, and frequently bring frost to the higher elevations. Under these conditions, a windbreaker and a sweater feel very comfortable. Visitors who bring only lightweight clothing can be in for an uncomfortable session if their visit and a visit by one of the *friajes* happen to coincide.
