## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE DARWIN AREA (NORTHERN TERRITORY), AUSTRALIA

LOCATION: Darwin is located on the northern coast of Australia. It is the capital and largest city in the Northern Territory. Darwin is situated on a peninsula between Beagle Gulf on the north and Frances Bay to the south. Both are inlets off of the Timor Sea. Elevations in town are close to sea level, and much of the surrounding land is mangrove swamp.

COMMENTS: Darwin has a two-season tropical year, with the seasons based on rainfall. Temperatures vary only slightly from month to month throughout the year, and the temperatures on any given day can and probably do occur in every month. The rainy season runs from late November through early April in most years. The rainy season is very hot, very humid, and very wet. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) are quite a bit higher than those shown in the table or on the thermometers. It rains most days, but not every day. Rivers flood and many roads become impassable. Heavy showers are more common than prolonged light rains. The rest of the year is relatively dry--virtually rainless from May through September. It's still quite hot, but afternoon humidities drop down quite a bit and bring the sensible temperatures with them. This is the most popular season with visitors. Darwin's latitude just south of the Equator protects it from most tropical storms of the hurricane/typhoon variety.
