SUNSHINE GUIDE TO TIMUCUAN ECOLOGICAL AND HISTORIC PRESERVE, FLORIDA

LOCATION: Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve is located on the northeast outskirts of Jacksonville, in extreme northeastern Florida. The seventy-odd square miles of the Preserve are bordered (more or less) by the Nassau River to the north, and the suburbs of Jacksonville to the west. The Preserve is by no means a continuous area, but contains more than 300 public and private in-holdings—some quite sizeable. The Preserve shares its Visitor Center with Fort Caroline National Memorial on the south bank of the St. Johns River, a half-dozen miles upstream from its mouth. Most of the Preserve is salt marsh, with coastal dunes and hardwood hummocks. It contains archeological sites dating back some 6,000 years.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 63% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 54% in December, to a high of 72% in April. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to 26, and the highest should be near 98. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you feel) will be substantially higher than actual ones from June through September. Humidities are high all year around. Winter (December through February) features cool to mild (sometimes warm) days and chilly to cold nights. A half-dozen nights each winter will drop below the freezing point. Winter rains tend to be light and fairly persistent. Summer (June through September) brings hot to very hot days and sultry and warm nights. Afternoon and evening thundershowers are common. The official hurricane season runs from June through November, but this part of the coast gets few such storms. The Timucuan area has one chance in fifty of having a hurricane in any given year.
