COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 63% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 54% in December, to a high of 71% in sunny April. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to 27 at some chilly winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 99 on some sultry summer afternoon. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you feel) will be substantially higher than actual ones from June through September. Humidity is high both day and night throughout the year. Winter (December through February) features mild to cool days and chilly to cold nights. Frosty mornings are less likely here than farther inland, but will occur on three or four mornings each winter. Snow flurries are not unknown, but snow on the ground is exceedingly rare. Summer (June through September) has hot to very hot and humid days and warm and sultry nights. Afternoon and evening thundershowers are common. Hurricanes are most likely in August and September, but often pass by this stretch of coast. The area has one chance in fifty of having such a storm in any given year.
