## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE HELENA AREA, MONTANA

LOCATION: Helena (HELL'-uh-nuh), the capital of Montana, is located in the west-central part of that state. The city is situated in the Missouri River drainage, and is surrounded by various ranges of the Rocky Mountains. Elevations are over 4,000 feet above sea level in town.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 59% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 42% in December, to a high of 77% in July. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -25°, and the highest should be near 97°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as actual ones on the cooler days, and a few degrees cooler than actual ones on the warmer ones. The area has a mountain version of the four-season year. Summers are short, essentially the months of July and August. Summer afternoons are very sunny, quite dry, and hot to warm. Summer afternoon and evening thunderstorms are fairly common, but don't necessarily bring much--if any--rain. Summer nights are distinctly cool. Winter afternoons are short, fairly cloudy, humid, and below freezing much of the time. Winter nights are very cold and drop below zero twenty or so times each winter. Almost all of the winter precipitation comes as snow, but--since there's not much winter precipitation--is quickly blown by the winds into sheltered spots.
