LOCATION: Dallas is located in the northeastern quarter of Texas. It is situated in the Great Plains, astride the Trinity River, in gently-rolling countryside. Elevations are everywhere within a few hundred feet of sea level.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 64% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 62% from December through February, to a high of 9% in July. The year's lowest temperature should be close to 13°, and the highest should be near 104°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as actual ones—a bit cooler during the winter months, and a bit higher during early summer. Only three or four afternoons a winter season will remain below freezing. About half the years will get less than an inch of snow. About a third of the years get only a trace. Spring and early summer are the seasons for frontal (as opposed to local, heat-generated) thunderstorms. These storms will occasionally breed tornadoes. Your chances of actually encountering one are about the same as your winning a million-dollar lottery. Some people, usually scientists, chase them for fun and knowledge. You might be better off heading for the designated shelter when the warning sounds.
