## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE WASATCH MOUNTAINS RESORT AREAS, UTAH

LOCATION: The Wasatch Mountains are located in central Utah. They run north/south, starting from just below the Idaho border and ending just at the edge of the Colorado Plateau country near I-70. Elevations range from just under 5,000 feet on the lower slopes to some 11,750 at the summit of Mount Timpanogos. The table below is representative of the 8,700-foot elevation typical of such ski resorts as Alta, Brighton, Deer Valley, Park City, Park West, Snowbird, Solitude, Sundance, and Wolf Mountain. Many of these ski resorts are world-class, and are famous for their powder snow. The Wasatch Mountains generally get good ski conditions well before the Rocky Mountain resorts, with the ground being frozen and snow-covered by the middle of October.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 66% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 43% in December, to a high of 83% from July through September. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -23°, and the highest should be near 81°. Sensible summer afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be up to 5° cooler than actual ones. Elevation and--to a lesser degree--slope orientation rule local climates. You can expect daytime temperatures to drop an average of 1°F for each 300'-increase in elevation--and vice versa going downhill. As in all mountains, the direction the slope is facing makes a tremendous difference in how much sunshine and how much rain the slope gets.
