SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE GAULEY RIVER NATIONAL RECREATION AREA, WEST VIRGINIA

LOCATION: The Gauley River National Recreation Area is located in the Appalachian Mountains of southwestern West Virginia. The NRA stretches some 25 miles down the Gauley River from Summersville Dam, covering some eighteen square miles of riverbank. Elevations on the rive range from about 1,900 feet above sea level down to about 900 feet. The river contains many ClassV+ rapids, and is one of the most challenging in the eastern part of the country. Much of the land in the area is privately-owned, and the only public access is at the campground below the dam. The campground is primitive—no water and no flush toilets. This river is strictly for experienced river-runners, and can be quite dangerous.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 48% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 34% in December and January, to a high of 60% in June. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to -7 on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 90 on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be pretty much the same as actual ones. From December through February, about one day in four will remain below freezing all day long. Three or four nights each winter will drop below freezing. Snowfall is highly variable from place to place and year to year. Summer weather is fairly stable, but spring and fall are seasons of transition, with rapid changes in weather. Water temperatures average about 50°F-a bit higher in the summer and quite a bit colder in the winter.
